There is a way of testing if VOCs are used or not. At UK grand prix and other national tournaments they use some sort of box which you put the bat in for a couple of minutes and it senses if there are any VOCs. This is really sensitive and will even detect any cleaner which contains VOCs or even if you recently used super glue on a broken handle (which I saw somebody had to use a spare bat for).

Tenergy 05 is supposed to be a good replacement for speed glue and replaces Butterfly's 'High Tune' series which got banned.

Most rubbers to replace speed glue just use tensor technology which is supposed to be as good, but nothing feels the same to be honest even with Butterfly's Optimizer One.
